COUNSELING CORNER

Diegueño Counseling News Middle School Transitions

There are two types of transitions that need to be made when a student arrives at middle school-academic and social. It is not uncommon to see students having difficulty balancing homework, family life and outside activities as the new school year begins. Be sure that your student is organizing themselves for success. Agendas should be written daily, backpacks should be cleaned out at least once a week and homework should be done nightly. Don't accept the "I don't have homework" excuse you may hear. Students should have homework nightly. If your child is struggling with the academic transition, you may need to help them set up some type of organization system and monitor their homework closely.

Be sure that they are breaking down long term projects into small parts and that they are not procrastinating with their assignments. If they are finding the material difficult, encourage them to ask questions in class or during CAT. Be sure to talk with your student's counselor if your child is experiencing consistent academic difficulty.

The social transition to middle school can often be overwhelming for students. Not only do they have to adjust to a new school with new rules, they are experiencing new social expectations and pressures that perhaps they've never dealt with before. If your student needs help dealing with this, please encourage them to come to see their counselor as we have many ways in which to help. Encourage students to get involved with activities on campus, whether it's attending a dance, joining a club, or participating in lunchtime activities. These are great ways to meet new friends who share similar interests. Encourage self-advocacy by role playing conversations that your student might need to have with their teachers. Work with them on graceful ways of getting out of sticky social situations. Just saying no is great, but how to say it can be complicated.

Counselors are available to help with any type of assistance that you may need, so feel free to contact us.

Please report all absences by sending an email to dgattendance@sduhsd.net or calling 760-944-1892 ext. 6605.



If your student needs to leave campus during school hours for any kind of appointment, medical, dental, orthodontist or simply going out of town. Please request an Off-Campus Pass 48-hours in advance through email or phone.

- 1. To minimize classroom interruption, please remind your student to pick the off-campus pass before school on the day of their appointment
- 2. If your pick-up time is during break or lunchtime, please remind your student to meet you in the attendance office for check-out.

3. REMINDER to all Parents and Guardians:

For the safety of our students a Parent or Guardian will always need to sign-out a student through the attendance window in the administration building. Students cannot walk or ride their bikes/e-bikes home.

4. Anyone picking up a student is required to show their ID

To clarify an "Off-Campus pass" is for the student to be able to show the teacher they have permission to leave class to meet parent/guardian at the attendance office. If the pick-up time is during nutrition break (10:15) or Lunchtime (12:40 - 1:15), remind your student to meet you in the attendance office for the check-out process.

How to Get a Bike Tag:

All students riding a bicycle (traditional or E) will need to get a bike tag. Please start submitting the below information to the front office. Enforcement will begin on October 4. As we get closer to the date, we will do a mass bike tag drive to place the tags on bikes (more info to come).

Submit bike permit application (including parent/guardian signature) to the assistant principal's office. Students must submit a new application every year.

We will affix a bike tag to your bike.

Provide proof of having attended a bike safety training. Some options include:




